# Elders' Epistle

Thanksgiving celebration! Often Thanksgiving is spent with family and friends gathered around a table sharing in a feast. Many times it is a time to get reconnected with family or friends that you have not seen for awhile—college student home from school or a relative visiting from out of state. Gathered together, eating together, talking together, and laughing together. *Together*.

**Something Bigger** 

The Bible tells us that we are each a part of something bigger. We as Christians are members of various entities all at the same time:

We are soldiers in the army of God (2 Timothy 2:3-4).

We are stones in a living temple (1 Corinthians 3:16; 1 Peter 2:4-5).

We are described as sheep in a flock (John 10:14–16).

And...we are children of God in the household/family of God (Ephesians 2:19; Romans 8:16-17).

Notice how the Bible tells us we are members *of something*, *not* intended to be isolated individuals.

Community

People have an internal, innate desire for community that is natural. Each of us come from a family of origin with a mother and father, some better at parenting than others. Often we grow and mature and create our own families by marriage.

The ultimate family we belong to is the family of God, whether in this world we are married, single, widowed, or divorced, our Father in heaven gave us His son Jesus by whom we can become the children of God. *Beautiful*.

Our local church is the gathering together of members of this family of God in order to worship God together, to serve God together, to serve one another and to love one another. This phrase "one another" is used in over twenty verses to describe how the family of God is to relate together:

**Colossians 3:16**—teaching and admonishing one another

Galatians 6:2—bear one another's burdens

Romans 12:10—love one another

1 Thessalonians 5:11—
encourage one another

James 5:16—*pray* for one another

**Ephesians 4:2**—tolerating one another in love

showing hospitality to one another and

Ephesians
4:32—be kind
to one another.

It is a tall order, but God does not give us commands that we can not obey.

These verses and others show us a picture of our place in the family of God as a warm, secure place that many people did not have growing up in their families of origin.

#### A Christmas Analogy:

erhaps some of you have experienced this first-hand: You come up with the best Christmas gift ever, searching multiple stores before practically having to fight for the last one in town. You lovingly wrap the gift and place it under the tree. On Christmas morning, your young child opens said gift, and spends the next hour playing with the wrapping paper and box.

The cause of this scene, repeated over and over throughout history, is unclear. Perhaps the parents do not understand their child's wants very well. Whatever the case, there seems to be a disconnect between the expectations of the giver and those of the receiver.

### Who Has the Power?

here's this thing that Americans are known for: *independence*. It probably stems from a history of settling a new land in a "I did it my way" sort of way and is so deeply steeped in our culture that it can be difficult to recognize. It's also a trait that comes into direct conflict with the next attribute of God that we'll discuss: His sovereignty.

To talk about a quality, one must be clear on its definition, so off to merriam-webster.com we go. After a slew of phrases about "possessing supreme power" and "exercising supreme authority" and "of the most exalted kind" there's this paragraph:

Sovereign has everything to do with power. It often describes a person who has supreme power or authority...God is described as "sovereign" in a number of Bible translations. In addition to describing ones who have power, the word sovereign also often describes power: to have sovereign power is to have absolute power—that is, power that cannot be checked by anyone or anything.

#### God's Sovereignty

As Christians, we readily admit God's sovereignty. We like verses like **Romans 8:28**, depending on God's sovereignty to work out every situation for our good, assuming that "our good" equates to our happiness or our ease...or at least something good for a few comments on social media.

#### We Want It All

The truth is, though, that even as we acknowledge God's sovereignty, we often try to grab it

humanity). We are limited, bound by time and place and

energy, with much *less* power than our independent selves would like to admit to. And yet, we continually grasp for control, seeking to manipulate the circumstances in which we find ourselves, attempting to exert power over the people around us.

#### **Living Under God's Sovereignty** To truly acknowledge and live

for ourselves (and sovereignty is one of those immutable attributes that just doesn't

under God's sovereignty requires three things of us. We must admit our dependence on Him and submit to His **direction** in our lives. We must yield ourselves to His

> **authority**, understanding that He directs the entire span of history, from beginning to end every inflection and nuance of every interaction—and He works out His purposes in it.

#### The Cornerstone: TRUST

Each of these three things relies on trust—*trust* that the hard things and the things that seem wrong in our world are the right things God wills. We must *trust* that God's way truly is better than our way, even when we desperately want our way to prevail.

#### **Much Activity**

In one corner of the room there was a group of about 5–7 working on LuoPads that were sent to a mission office in Florida. The 200 LouPads made this year went

to countries where women need hygiene products for personal care.

They can't just go to a store to buy these necessities.

Next, you'll see two quilts out on quilt frames waiting to be tied. Women sit on chairs around the quilts tying square knots in specific corners. Twenty–five quilts were tied this year and given to UGM, Sable House, wedding couples, and new babies. Another table has a couple of ladies cutting out or sewing clothing protectors for adults.



These will go to Dallas Retirement Village. Two ladies are busy going around removing the quilts on frames or putting up new quilts for the next tying project. Someone will be at the ironing board, ironing the wrinkles out of fabric. This busy work happens for about 2 ½ hours. At 11 am, sharp projects are put away and our program begins.

#### **Program Meeting**

The president opens our meeting with prayer. We read/recite our Scripture verse for the year. Minutes are read, old or new business is discussed, and our

speaker for the day is introduced.



We try to have a missionary give our devotional, or someone may speak from Crisis Pregnancy Center, **Sable House**, **Union Gospel Mission** (UGM) women's home or even

one of our own ladies may give her testimony or life story. We try

to always have at least 15 minutes to pray in small groups for the requests given.

#### **Meal Time**

At noon we have our prayer of thankfulness for our potluck lunch together. We have been blessed to have two couples serve us in

preparing the food, heating it and setting it out, then later cleaning up after the lunch. *We are so blessed.* 

Any lady that would like to join our group is welcome to come. Come early to help in our projects or come just for the devotional meeting and lunch. *We'd love to have you.*

### lan and Linda McFarland



ello. We are lan and Linda McFarland, missionaries sent out from EBC in 1986.

Ian is from N. Ireland and Linda from Dallas, Oregon—we both are registered nurses and met in Scotland in 1978, when we were working and studying there.

#### **After Bible College**

Following Bible college in England, we felt God was leading us to work in Madrid, Spain, with Bible Christian Union. Our focus there was learning the language and culture, and doing friendship evangelism. As part of a team there, the goal was to plant evangelical churches in the Madrid area.

#### On To Quito!

By late 1991, we realized that we needed to make changes and work in the medical area where we were most gifted. We both were familiar with the work of HCJB in Ecuador and applied to work with them as nurses. We were accepted and after some additional fund raising, we left with our four boys for Quito, Ecuador, in January of 1994.

Ian's tasks in Quito initially were at Hospital Vozandes working

on the wards, in the pharmacy, and in central supply. He ran the tuberculosis clinic for a time as well.

In 1995 the opportunity arose for him to organize the medical caravan work from Quito. This he did faithfully for about 19 years with his base in Quito. His truck would go out to the mountain (or coastal) villages for a week at a time with pastors, doctors, a dentist, helpers, supplies, Bible literature, and Bible based films to show the village people.

#### **Mixed Response**

Response to this work was mixed—the indigenous people were thankful for someone who would give them medical attention as they often were a long distance from any clinics or hospitals. The spiritual response was varied, but God's word was taught and seeds planted.

Before our first year in Ecuador was completed, we had added a daughter to our team of four boys! Linda's primary job in those first years was as wife and mother. The children attended the nearby Alliance Academy and all graduated from there.



#### Children Off to School

When the children were in school, Linda was able to begin part-time work at Hospital Vozandes as well. She worked in emergency, outpatient clinic, wards, wound clinic, and taught prenatal classes to groups of expectant parents.

In 2006, she accepted a ministry job at the Alliance Academy and worked there part-time in the nurses' office until 2013. This was an open opportunity to speak into the students lives as they came in to see her with their ailments.

We were able to take part in other ministries and learning opportunities as well when we lived in Quito.

We were able to take part in other ministries and learning opportunities as well when we lived in Quito. These involved Bible studies, Pan de Vida (an outreach to the underserved population), Spotlight (sharing Christ while teaching English), and involvement in the local Ecuadorian church.

#### **Empty Nest**

The year 2013 brought more changes to our lives. Our last child

graduated from the Alliance and flew the nest. The mission's community development department (which Ian's caravan was a part of) wanted to move its base to the jungle where there was more need for the ministry. We were now available to make that move, and when we returned from a home ministry assignment in January, 2014, we moved our worldly goods down to

Shell, near the edge of the Amazon jungle.

#### **Busy Times**

The need for medical/ dental caravans in this jungle area is great. Ian had many opportunities to take his teams out

to various places far from health centers. His mode of transport was usually in a Missionary Aviation Fellowship plane, or by road in a truck and sometimes by canoe. He prepared the equipment, gathered the medications, made application to the health ministry for permissions to do the caravans, organized getting the team together, then set up the caravan in the outlying village, assisted the doctors and dentists as needed, took down equipment again, brought the team and his supplies back home, and cleaned things up for the next trip. It kept him busy!

Meanwhile Linda worked for several years as coordinator of the short term workers and summer intern ministry in Shell. She also filled in for about 18 months as coordinator of the maintenance department (what a job for a nurse!) and learned a lot from the workers.

When the administrative assistant left the Shell office, she worked part—time at the front desk to receive guests, keep some finances balanced, and do whatever was needed.

In 2018 the missionary who organized the cleft lip program retired to Australia. After a

few months, the mission released Linda from her other responsibilities, and she took over leadership for the group of children who were left. This group of four

needed more surgeries and dental work. This required trips to Quito for doctor visits, hospitalizations, and treatment with braces.



The medical caravan outreach was something both of us were able to do together at times. What a blessing to see people respond to the preaching of God's word in their mother tongue when Ian took out a pastor who could speak their language.

We saw growth in jungle churches and praised God for His Holy



Spirit who draws people to Himself. The longer we worked in Ecuador, the more we saw very clearly that the work is God's! We are His instruments but it is He who moves ahead, beside and after us in the spiritual realm.

#### **Retirement Awaits**

December 31 of this year will be the last official day of our mission work with Reach Beyond (HCJB changed its name along the way). It has been a tremendous privilege and challenge to work cross culturally. We have learned far more than we have taught and have grown deeper in our own faith in God.

#### THANK YOU!

We are currently living in Dallas and are so thankful for the EBC. They have backed us and supported us for many years and it is with some sadness that we say farewell to that phase of our lives. But God continues to have a plan for our lives and we trust Him to show us the way ahead.

From the depths of our hearts, we say **THANK YOU** to God for His great faithfulness to us in so many ways and to you who have prayed so faithfully for us and backed us financially as well for many years.

We look forward to sharing in the fellowship of this church in the days ahead. •
