hen Jesus spoke the words of the Lord's Prayer he was giving us an example that we should follow. All of the words are powerful and poignant, teaching us how to pray and who we should become as God works in us. But, in this article, I want to focus on a particular phrase: *Give us this day our daily*

**Details Count**Notice the wording. Not give us bread but *give us our daily bread*. Daily.

We are to trust God, day to day. Normally I want to ask for more than a day's allotment of bread—for a week's worth, perhaps a year's supply. But God so often provides for our needs daily, not all at once. I used to contemplate this.

#### Better?

Wouldn't it be more economical to provide for our needs in bulk? Wouldn't this keep us from worry—induced ulcers and from bombarding Heaven's throne room with repetitive begging prayers?

#### **BUT ... He Knows Best!**

But God knows best. He doesn't have a daily limit on miracles. God isn't costing Himself extra time by doling out His gifts one at a time. Each miracle He performs doesn't incur a surcharge. God acts according to His eternal power and wisdom while enacting His own will.

#### For OUR Benefit!

It is evident that His daily provision for our needs is for *our* benefit. While God delights in giving good gifts, He does not want us to lose sight of Him and fixate on His blessings. He doesn't meet our needs so we can run off and forget Who provided for them. Our Lord is so much more than a wealthy benefactor.

He is a Father who desires for His children to know Him. And the reality is that necessity tends to improve our prayer life. Our needs remind us to pray and by praying we come to know God more intimately.

#### My Wish for Us

I wish we would be just as diligent in prayer during times of abundance. This is not usually the case. We are more apt to pray when we are needy, more likely to seek God when we are hurting.

There is also the matter of faith. **Hebrews 11:6** says that without faith it is *impossible* to please God.



**Romans 1:17** says the just shall live by faith.

#### **Opportunities Await**

Waiting on God, day by day, is an opportunity for us to learn to trust. If God provided all at once, where would the faith be? How would we continue learning of His holy character and see His gracious provision? If he gave us all our blessings up front, I'm pretty sure we would focus on the visible blessings and lose sight of Him who is unseen.

#### Not So!

I used to entertain the fiction that I could grow in maturity *without* God stretching me. This is not true.

Through struggles, questions, and hardships I have learned to fix my gaze more intently on His countenance and learned to listen more carefully for His voice. Such lessons have been learned slowly



and painfully, seeing that God often provides in the moment of need, not before. Of course, there are times that God does bless me before I'm desperate and gives gifts I haven't even asked for. God is indeed good and generous, yet I am learning that the gifts are *not* the prize. **The prize is God himself!**


#### My Prayer

At EBC our next celebratory event is on Friday—


either described as "Good Friday" here in America, or as "Black

ndoubtedly, our church leaders have been busy preparing for the activities of Good Friday and Easter. Whether honoring old traditions or exploring new ideas, this is the season when we gather and attempt to grasp the amazing truth of a spotless Lamb who was slain for us, and who rose victorious over sin and death.

This is also a time when most churches see a few visitors. For various reasons, people who are not typically church goers often show up for holidays. This is an opportunity for each of us to make a difference, and we should be preparing our hearts for that task.

I recently met a couple who are relatively new to our church. They said that the first day they visited, a lady caught them before they could leave and said: "I don't know you!" She introduced herself, then walked them around the church, introducing them to family after family. They said everyone was so friendly and loving, they just felt like they were home.

This reminds me of a significant moment in the Easter story. After the Passover supper in the upper room, Jesus washed his disciples' feet, and then in **John 13:34** he gave them a new commandment: that they love one another. In verse 35, he said: "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (ESV)

Sometimes I fear we think people will know we are Jesus' disciples because of our good biblical teaching, but it takes a mature believer to recognize good teaching from bad. Jesus says the thing by which everyone can recognize his influence is not what we teach, but what we do. We must love others. Perhaps one implication of that truth is that before we snap a family photo in our Easter clothes or run home to eat the Easter ham, we should connect with someone to let them know that they are truly loved.

Let us pray that God will love someone through us.



May the love of Christ penetrate our churches until who we are is undeniable!

hen our second child, **Jesalynn**, was born, our son **Tyson** was just over 16 months old. We were concerned that, while he wanted to show love to his sister, his rough and tumble little boy methods might not be the right approach. So as he interacted with Jesalynn in the beginning, we often encouraged him to be gentle with her. We showed him how to touch her carefully instead of jumping onto the couch almost on top of her.

He learned how to show her a toy instead of dropping it on her face. He found that sudden loud sounds would startle her, but he could pat her on the shoulder or back to help calm her down again.

#### **Understanding and Learning**

Being gentle with his sister required Tyson to understand that his sister had different wishes and needs than he did, and to act accordingly. It was rarely perfect, because toddlers have a lot of energy and enthusiasm and not a lot of foresight, but he

did learn to treat her gently. And if a toddler can learn to treat someone else with gentleness, so can we!

#### **Following His Example**

Our God is gentle...and I think that's an attribute we don't often stop to consider. *Do we truly appreciate God's gentleness with us?* 

So often He works slowly, giving us time to adjust our hearts

and using gentle nudges to turn our thoughts toward Him. He's God—He could just force each person into subservient obedience! But instead, He works gently in our hearts.

#### **Meeting Their Needs and Feelings**

And how does God's attribute of gentleness inform our behavior towards others? When we treat each other gently, we put their needs and feelings into account as we interact with them.

This *might* mean realizing that they process information at a slower rate

than we do, and finding the patience to wait while they formulate their thoughts. It *may* mean recognizing a sensitivity to a difficult topic and approaching that topic in a way that allows them to feel safe while processing their feeling about it.

#### Follow the Bible!

Gentleness in our everyday life means living out **Philippians** 

2:3-5. "Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit.
Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to

your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others." (NIV).

This is a great opportunity to put that **Golden Rule** into practice and think about how the other person feels and how we can reflect Christ in the way we treat them.

So as you interact with those around you this week, stop to consider how God has shown gentleness to you—and how you might display that same characteristic to each person you encounter.

And if a toddler can learn to treat someone else with gentleness, so can we!

olivia ranks at or near the bottom among Latin American countries in several areas of health and development, including poverty, education, fertility, malnutrition, mortality, and life expectancy. On the positive side, more children are being vaccinated and more pregnant women are getting prenatal care and having skilled health practitioners attend their births.

Bolivia's income inequality is the highest in Latin America and one of the highest in the world.

Public education is of poor quality, and educational opportunities are among the most unevenly distributed in Latin America, with girls and indigenous and rural children less likely to be literate or to complete primary school. The lack of access to education and family planning services helps to sustain Bolivia's high fertility rate—approximately three children per woman.

Bolivia's lack of clean water

and basic sanitation, especially in rural areas, contributes to health problems.

As a brief update, we mailed out our summer brochures a few weeks ago and in April we will have our Annual Meeting. This meeting is open to the public where we provide a supper then have a time of singing and cover any business that Bethel's board of directors has for the evening.



One of the biggest challenges we are facing in our mission work is finding volunteers for the summer ministry at camp.

#### Spreading the Word

We have seen in the past few years that it is getting harder and harder to have young people commit to being a volunteer.

# **History of Bethel Bible Camp**

n the fall of 1946, the **Earnest Nelson** family was transferred to the Sutherland area by the American Sunday School Union. They bought a place in Sutherland (*property was 100 by 400 feet*). It contained a house, garage and an old barn.

Soon after the Nelsons came they felt the need to began a camping program. So in June of 1947 the first camp was held. A tent was rented for a chapel. The girls slept

in the haymow of the barn, and the boys slept in the garage. The Nelson home was used for the kitchen and dining room.

Before the 1948 camp, studs on the barn had been sawed in half, the top part lowered down, and the lower part moved out to the east to make a building twice as long as it had been. A chapel was built as well. Camp was held even as the buildings were being finished over a period of time.

In 1950 a basement was dug and a building erected on it. The basement held a kitchen and dining room. The upper part was the girls' dorm. The boys used the old building. In 1978, the girls' dorm was struck by lightning and burned down. The camp board, after much prayer and searching, decided to move the Camp to Wellfleet on a 4 acre tract of ground. The old camp was sold to a Baptist Church and construction began in Wellfleet. The 1979 camps were held at Camp Joy, in Alma, Nebraska. By 1980 one building was ready in Wellfleet; so camps were held there. The first (main) building was a kitchen, dining room and chapel. In 1981 a dorm was built for girls and in 1986 the boys' dorm was added. Since 1987, a recreational pavilion has been added and a new staff/ shelter facility (top is staff quarters and the basement is a classroom/storm shelter). The 330 acre Seller's homestead property was donated to Camp in 1996.

Several missionaries served the Sutherland field, including **Dirk Derksens** in 1964, **George Cochrans** in 1966, **Paul Johnson**served from 1971-1987, and John and Carol Lewis served from

1987-2017. In 2013 Kevin and Jennifer Domes came to serve at Bethel Bible Camp alongside John and Carol, then in 2017 Kevin took over as Camp Director and Jennifer as Head Cook. John and Carol still serve in the area with other ministries as well as assisting at the camp when needed.
