How Often?

How many times does a small portion of the body shoulder all the labor and risk while the majority is content to be the audience cheering on their efforts?

In this regard, the church has been compared to a professional football game: 22 people on the field desperately in need of rest being watched by fifty thousand spectators desperately in need of exercise.

Not a Spectator "Sport"

The truth is that we are **all** called to be engaged in service. In 1 **Corinthians 12**, Paul reminds us that every believer is an important part of the body of Christ.

While we may not all have the same function, we all have an important role to play. If our physical bodies suddenly missed the function of a kidney, knee, or eye, we would feel the effect on our functionality. *In the* same way, the health and impact of the church body is diminished when individuals remain on the sideline.

Make *no* mistake, God can complete His work *without* us. As in the case of David, He can accomplish mighty things through His faithful followers. But even in these instances, it is a

sad thing to see people forfeit the opportunities for service and reward that God graciously gives them.

Opportunities to Honor Him!

Too often, we think of our service as a *chore* or *burden* instead of a chance to honor our Savior and to join Him in His work.

This wrong thinking is reminiscent of the fable The Little Red Hen. At the end of the tale, the hen who has done all of the work receives all of the reward while the others miss out on the blessing. Make no mistake—what we do in this life will echo into eternity. Earthly accolades and trophies will fade away, but the treasures which we store in Heaven will last forever.

In the book of **Nehemiah**, Nehemiah was used by God to rebuild the walls. Dividing the city into sections, chapter 3 highlights the contributions of the people who participated in this great project. Yet, in verse five, we see a notable comment. The nobles of Tekoa

"...would not put their shoulders to the work..." (NIV).

How Sad!

What a sad statement! In this immortalized list of people who participated in the work, the nobles of Tekoa are remembered only as those who refused to be of service.

I hope we are the people who serve for our Savior's purposes and pleasure, that we labor for a crown that will not fade, and that we would be a part of the great and marvelous work that God is accomplishing.

1 Corinthians 12 (NIV)

4 There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them.

5 There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord.

6 There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.

7 Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.

8 To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit,

9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit,

10 to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues.

11 All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines. 🕆

The word gospel literally means "good news" and it occurs almost 100 times in the Bible. Nearly all of those verses are about preaching and speaking the gospel. And if we are unclear about what the gospel is, I can summarize it in just 10 words: Christ died for our sins and rose from the dead (see 1 Corinthians 15:3–6).

How We Learn About Christ

Romans 10:14 reminds us that people hear about Christ by other people telling them about Christ, so we understand the importance of sharing and speaking the message of all that Jesus Christ has done for us. But what about a verse like 2 Thessalonians 1:8 that tells us to obey the gospel, or 2 Timothy 1:8 to suffer for the gospel? There are then some other aspects of the gospel.

Time to Readjust?

If the gospel has become that thing in our mind that is only good for salvation and not much beyond



that, then we need to readjust our thinking.

The gospel is certainly good for salvation (**Romans 1:16**), but it also needs to be something that influences our thoughts and actions well beyond the moment of our salvation.

The gospel should affect our life every day, even if we have been a follower of Christ for 50 years. Every morning we get up we should think of the gospel, we should ponder the work and sacrifice of Christ

Jim Walker: I started donating blood when I was in the military. To me, it was an act of kindness. This was something I could do that would be life saving for an individual. I have given just over 13 gallons. Personally, I don't like needles, but I feel good knowing I am able to donate. If you are able, I would recommend this life saving opportunity.

EBC Blood Drive Monday, April 28 12 noon to 5 pm

Dorothy Friesen: Hi! I'd love to encourage any of you who are healthy and able to donate blood to do so! I started donating while in college and have continued doing so all these many years. I'm pleased to say I've donated 98 pints to date. It's a rewarding feeling to know someone out there is being helped because I gave the blood they desperately needed. It is not a difficult thing to do, is not painful, and it only takes about an hour of your time! And they give you snacks afterwards too!

Heathy Bodies ... Healthy Blood

You must be healthy to donate so your blood pressure, pulse, and blood iron content are important indicators. In the past two blood drives, the level of iron content in the blood has been a challenge for some donors. (Your red blood cells use iron to attract oxygen molecules and carry it to all parts of your body. A lack of oxygen can impact your body is so many ways: tiredness, fatigue to mention just two.)

A whole blood donation consists of one pint of blood, containing mostly red blood cells, so therefore one's iron content is important. If you plan to donate, eat more—*or start eating*—iron rich food (*red meat, pork, poultry, tuna, white beans, red kidney beans, spinach, raisins, and iron-fortified cereal*) at least three weeks before donating. This should help one's iron level to be within an acceptable range.

Saved or Not Saved?

Ave you ever wondered whether you have really been saved or whether you are counting on the faith of your parents or grandparents?

No Grandchildren!

You probably heard the saying *"God does not have any grandchildren."*

This statement commonly refers to that fact that we *cannot* rest on the faith of others and be saved. Some people would erroneously have you believe that following strict religious traditions will offer you a way to salvation.

Still Empty

If you have been caught up in a religious tradition you probably have learned that it is impossible to do all that the traditions require. You might have been asked to do



some sort of penance for breaking traditions and say a few rote prayers to be forgiven. No matter how hard you try you still have an

emptiness in your heart.

God's sovereignty in salvation is shown in Romans 8:29-30 (NASB **1995)** which reads, "For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He (Jesus) would be the firstborn among many brethren; and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified."

We've Been Called God has called each of us

to be reconciled to Himself. **Ephesians 2:2–3** says that we were *formerly* of the sons of disobedience, living lives following the lusts of our flesh and our minds and were by nature children of wrath. We were dead in our sins but have been made alive together with Christ. God has shown His great

kindness by extending grace to us. Ephesians 2:8-9 (NASB 1995)

says, "For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast."

All Have Sinned

In **Romans 3:21–26** we learn that all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. We do not match God's holy standard.

We receive forgiveness by faith through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus. God publicly displayed Jesus, the perfect sacrifice, on the cross, the shedding of His blood as the full payment for our sins, when we place our faith in Jesus Christ. Because of Jesus' death and resurrection, we have peace with God, being justified by faith through our Lord Jesus Christ (**Romans** 5:1).


We were dead in our sins but have been made alive together with Christ.

What They Were Doing

The team of Elizabeth Schneider, Joey Loewen, DeeAnne and Darrel Hiebenthal were in Bolivia

assisting Ethnos360 missionaries, **Dan and Judy Burke**, make books for the Chimane people. Due to high humidity and other conditions, these books are printed and hand–bound. In other words, it's a labor–intensive project!

An Important Mission Field

Shortages in missionaries have caused Dan and Judy to step up their efforts to minister to the Chimane. As one might expect, the language barrier is immense with Dan and Judy being the only missionaries fluent in the Chimane language. Dan has made decisions on how to best provide classes and to fine-tune teaching materials for the Chimane. And, for her part, Judy is the only non-native woman who has learned the language to minister to the Chimane women.

PLEASE continue to pray for Dan and Judy in this outreach ministry. Pray that they receive divine guidance as to how to best proceed and that their health gives them the energy to carry out their tasks. **Come to Their Presentation!** The Bolivia Team will be making **a presentation at EBC on April 6.** Come and hear all about their trip *including*:

Spiritual Disciplines:

Listen For God!

Can I Have a Word?

ou're probably familiar with the concept of a *"word of the year*". Many people ask God to show them a word that they can focus on and seek to grow in during a given year. I've seen people choose words like *faith*, *intention*, *peace*... and more.



While I don't choose a word every year, I really felt God calling me

to learn to listen in 2024. My goal was two–fold:

To learn to listen to others (to intentionally hear the heart behind what they were telling me) **and**

💥 To listen to God.

Learning to Listen

I believe that I did grow in *how* I listened to others that year. But the longer I spent striving to listen to

God, the more I realized that it was going to require more time!

It's 2025, and my *"listen"* card still sits at the top of my prayer deck, reminding me each day *(or at least, most days)* to seek His voice.

For me, the biggest challenge in this area is learning to listen *for* God.

This involves clearing space in what seems like the Grand Central Station of my mind. When things—like a to-do list, a work problem, logistics of the next trip, the plot twist in the book I'm reading, concerns about relationships, scraps of thoughts for an article, and lyrics to a song that played on Sesame Street[®] in 1984 are all careening through my brain, there's little chance that I will hear the quiet voice of the Father. Even if I'm *trying* to hear His voice, *it's drowned out by the cacophony in my head.*

The Right Mindset

I tend to think that if I pause for a few minutes between Bible reading and prayer requests, that if I can sit

quietly for a moment or two, then I can expect Him to speak because I'm ready. And yet, God isn't really an on-demand sort of service. Yes, He's always available to listen—but we can't just stop for a few seconds and expect Him to immediately speak into our hearts.

Instead, we must find a frame of mind that allows us to listen consistently and expectantly for His voice, even in the swirling dust storm that sometimes makes up our mental life (*perhaps something like Elijah learning to hear the still, small voice of God in* **I Kings 19**).

And this is where some of those spiritual disciplines we've been discussing come in.

When we focus our minds on His Word through meditation and memorization, we pour His truth into our very souls. We still our

hearts long enough to consider what those Scriptures say, to ponder and to seek.

When we seek solitude for a weekend or spend a week fasting, we begin to create space into which He can speak.

When we curate and use a playlist of songs that remind us of God's qualities, we create moments where our hearts are attuned to His voice.

We begin to learn that our hearts can be still even when our hands are busy.

Growing in Listening

We begin to learn that our hearts can be still even when our hands are busy. And then, as we work alongside someone and hear pain in their voice, we follow the gentle prompting of our Father's voice and connect with that person, even as we continue to seek guidance from Him.

And then we begin to realize a greater awareness of God's presence in our lives. That subtle nudging, the applicable Bible verse that flows back into our mind exactly when needed, the lines from a song that seem to answer the question we've been

asking-they're there because there's room for them.

This isn't to say that we'll never hear actual words from God's voice audibly or in our minds. I specifically remember a time of desperation: standing alone in my house and thinking, I don't know how I can do this. And then, these words from God: Child, trust me. Simple words spoken directly into my heart, heard because the trial of that moment had stripped away all the distractions.

Consider Yourself Encouraged

So I encourage you to listen for God today. Sure, sit in your chair with your Bible open before you and wait expectantly for His voice. But take that attitude of expectancy with you throughout your day. Quiet your mind and create rhythms that turn your focus towards Him instead of away. Tune the frequency of your mind to His voice, so that the things of the world fade away and His words become clear. 🕆

Sometimes my mind wanders back to the years when my three children were small enough to be carried in what we called *"the bucket"*—the baby carrier with a handle, the carrier that can be snapped into a base into a vehicle.



I remember arriving at a destination and juggling a baby in that carrier plus a 3- and 4-year-old. I'd sling my purse over one shoulder and the diaper bag over the other, then slide my arm through the handle of the bucket, hold out my other hand for one of the other kids to grab, and expect that child to hold the hand of the remaining sibling.

The events began on Saturday, March 1, with a breakfast in the activity center. Following this delicious meal, EBC missionaries, **Ivan and Mary Goossen**

(pronounced *go–sun*) presented a glimpse into their ministry. That evening the Mission Committee, our pastors, and their spouses, were invited to a dinner at church. The Goossens then shared share more details of their work and financial needs were discussed.

Update and Q&A Sunday, March 2: Ivan and

Mary shared a brief update in both services and a longer presentation that evening with a Q&A time afterwards.

We kept them busy on Monday and Tuesday with a Connect group and also Ladies Missionary Fellowship. It was a privilege for some of the EBC families to host the Goossens for meals during their visit and quiz them even further!

What Did We Learn?

What did we learn from Ivan and Mary during their brief stay with us? The following is a brief synopsis. They serve with Avant Ministries (avantministries.org) in Brazil (which is actually where Ivan was born).

They initially were involved in church planting in Fortaleza where the Ebenezer church was started and continues to meet.

Another important part of their ministry has been in Christian radio at a place called Nova Russas where Harvest Radio was begun 20 years ago. The past five years they have been in a small

town *(the size of Dallas)* about four hours drive west of Fortaleza.

Ministry in Mucambo

At the conference we learned mostly about their ministry in this town, called Mucambo. The Goossen's goal there has been to get acquainted with the people, to share Christ with them and to have a church base where new believers can flourish and grow.



They developed a coffee shop called **Café e Graça** *(coffee and grace)* which is where they meet folk, serve coffee and have table games for the younger customers. A church in its early stages has developed from

moment He crushes the head of the snake, sin, and death are no more (**Revelations 12:9–10**).

Jesus also became the perfect priest. His sacrifice did not need to be done over and over like the imperfect animal sacrifices. He died once and for all—past and future. Jesus was also the king of kings. When He came, He came as a servant, but when Jesus rose again, He was exalted to the highest place.

Back to the Questions...

So now we come back to the questions of:

₭ Is God trustworthy?₭ Is He good?

There are days when we **know** what God says is true, even when everything in our life says it's not. In those moments we must chose to believe God is trustworthy.

Jesus said He would never leave us, and He's coming back to fix this broken world. *Now, is God trustworthy enough in our lives that we make Him our King?* ¹

ike Christmas, many will celebrate Easter but often gloss over *the real reason* for the holiday. They will hunt for eggs, give the kids Easter baskets, dress up to attend church, and have a joyous day. Also, like Christmas, we often forget that it is about Christ and what he did for us. As Easter approaches, I am trying to reflect on what Christ did for mankind.

Why This Gift?

I see three major reasons God (Jesus) gave us the Easter season:

First, He died to take away our sins.

Second, opened an avenue to reconnect with him (God)

Third, to confirm the existence of our eternal spirit.

Let's look at each more closely and maybe discover how wonderful the good news would have been to the first Christians.

First: Christ Took Away Sin

We all know about Adam bringing sin into the world. Sacrifices were offered to deal with sin. Man offered blood sacrifices of animals.

Some offerings were commanded, but the deaths of these animals could never truly take away sins. No amount of animal blood could wash the guilt of sin away.

That brings us to the cross. *Jesus become the final sacrifice for sin.* He rid the world of sin.



Read that again. He rid the world of sin. Our sins are forgiven. *"It's like it never even happened."*

It is important to realize that He died for all sin. There was no if-then attached to it. He bore the sins of the entire world. This included the criminals to His right and left. Nothing else was needed, no good works, or sacrifice. *Jesus paid everything.*

Second: Relationship with God

During Christ's ministry He taught us, through the beatitudes and parables, to have a relationship with the Father.

> After the crucifixion, sin no longer stood in the way, God became approachable. *Anyone* could have a relationship with Him. All

one had to do is exercise their free will, receive what Jesus offered, follow what Jesus had taught, and a relationship was available. A relationship that man's restless souls longed for. Here is the difference between the two criminals. One asked for a relationship and wanted to follow Christ; the other criminal *never saw the light*.

Third: Your Eternal Spirit

One must realize, that at this time in history, life after death was just a theory. No one had come back from

death to give proof. Kind of like we think of Bigfoot today.

Some think, no way. Many think it could be, but need to see one. A few, think there is enough evidence to prove they exist. This is similar to how people thought about eternal life.

Word of Jesus's three–year ministry had spread. Many understood the concept, but couldn't explain the miracles. They needed more proof. They got the proof they needed with the resurrection.

Many witnessed Christ after He had risen. It was good news! News that rapidly spread and the number of followers grew exponentially. I can't imagine how people rejoiced when they found out that an eternal spirit resides within them.

As we celebrate Easter, I'd like you to consider two things: Where are you and your eternal spirit going to spend eternity?

God is approachable and anyone can spend eternal life with Him. Many people today have forgotten or never heard the "Good News."

Let's have joyous celebration and make sure people know *wby* we are celebrating. 🕆


