These shoeboxes provide gifts to children throughout different parts of the world who most likely will never receive another Christmas gift in their lifetime. They should be **FUN AND FULL**. These guidelines help make the gift a special and meaningful experience for a child in need.

What To Include:

Children of all ages enjoy receiving a stuffed animal.

School Supplies: Spiral notebooks, pencils, pencil sharpeners, erasers, pens, colored pencils, markers, pencil case, index cards, solar powered calculators, blunt scissors, small rulers, glue sticks (**NO LIQUID GLUE**), small package of adhesive tape.

Toiletry Items: Toothbrushes, combs, brushes, hair ribbons & barrettes (for girls), washcloths.

Clothing: Hats, gloves, mittens, scarves, flip flops, shoes, socks, T-shirts, underwear, watches, sunglasses, bags, backpacks, purses, jewelry.

Other Suggestions Include:

Coloring books, crayons, yo-yos, marbles, tops, cars, balls of various kinds, Play-doh®, dolls, musical instruments, flashlights with batteries, puzzles, binoculars, compasses, chalkboards and chalk, jump rope, stickers, craft kits, books or picture books.



News from FEBC!

As in previous years, I am mindful that this letter falls between Thanksgivings. That is, the one in Canada and the one in the United States. So, this is a letter of praise and thanksgiving.

The need we have spoken about the most over the past few years has been financial, so I will begin there. God has blessed us so amazingly!

- ◆ Most of you know that last year our finances were in the black for the first time in years.
- ◆ This summer, we received permission from the government to release the restriction on over \$90,000 in funds—moving them from an unused account into the general fund.
- ◆ Churches and individuals continue to give generously, exceeding our projections.
- ◆ Our Ministries Coordinator monthly pledged support is still hovering around 76% of our goal, but with one-time donations (including a couple of recent large gifts from individuals), we are on track to exceed 93% of our goal this year!
- ◆ Our volunteer leadership teams (directors and commissions) are well staffed, and we have had new volunteers join several of these teams over the past year or two.

Gary Krehbiel (our Ministries Coordinator) was recently certified in a new leadership tool, the “Working Genius,” and he has already used this training to help several church leadership teams.

God is providing for our churches as well! Many of our churches are experiencing growth, and several who have been looking for a pastor have either recently hired or seem close to hiring the man God has prepared for them.

We continue to have discussions with churches who might consider joining our Fellowship in the future. Just a couple of weeks ago I was introduced to a pastor from a like-minded church outside our Fellowship. He was initially resistant to the idea of joining any group, as they were previously with a group that started weakening doctrinally. But after a series of conversations, he said he would bring up affiliation with the FEBC to his fellow leaders.



God is truly at work among us, providing for our needs, exceeding our expectations, and strengthening our churches and our Fellowship. Thanks be to God!

The Gift of Conflict

Our Role: Bearing

Spend a moment pondering with me: when you are offended by someone else's actions, or when offense you have caused is brought to your attention, *what is your first reaction? What about when your strong opinion on something differs from another person's?*

I know that I fight against **defensiveness** in these situations. I want to prove that I am in the right (*I usually am not*), that it's the other person who needs to change. And that attitude generally causes me to put distance between us. I might do that through a sharp retort, a refusal to consider their point of view, *or* by disengaging from the conversation.

Keeping Scripture Ingrained

Memorizing **Ephesians 4** caused me a lot of problems in this area. You see, when you memorize

Scripture, it becomes ingrained in you. The words you worked to store in your heart pop up at inopportune times, reminding you to:

Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with peace.
(Ephesians 4:2-3, NLT)

This month, we're tackling how we can make allowance for each other's faults. Other versions tell us to ***bear with one another in love***. As I've mulled over the idea of bearing with one another, I've often considered **Galatians 6:2**, which instructs us to bear one another's burdens.

What Is BEARING?

To bear is to carry, to assume the weight of, to support. Now picture with me: what does it look like to bear something with someone else? Can you do that from far away? **No.**

To bear anything with someone else, you must step closer to them in order to carry it. And we must

be willing to do the same thing in conflict.

When we decide to make allowance for each other's faults, we must be willing to love the other person regardless of the conflict between us. It takes grace and the desire to bear with someone else. This attitude determines to overlook the harsh comment or difference of opinion—because Christ has done the same for us!

Making Allowances

When we bear with one another, when we make allowance for each other's faults, we recognize that we are all still sinful humans struggling against a sin nature. We choose to respond in a manner that honors Christ instead of countering a hurtful word or action with a similar response.

Now, it's important to acknowledge that we are *not called* to ignore or enable sinful behavior. There is a time and place for bringing these things to someone's attention. But we have the ability to show Christ each time we step into conflict and towards the other person. This month, consider how you can bear with the people around you.

Keep Thinking:

☒ When you find yourself in conflict, what is your default attitude?

☒ Do you see the other person as an enemy to be fought, or as a hurting member of Christ's body who needs your support? +

A Call to Generational Faithfulness

A Sobering Mirror from Judges

In **Judges 8:33–35**, we encounter a sobering moment in Israel's history:

"Then it happened, as soon as Gideon was dead, that the sons of Israel again played the harlot with the Baals... And the sons of Israel did not remember Yahweh their God, who had delivered them from the hands of all their enemies on every side; nor did they show lovingkindness to the household of Jerubbaal (that is, Gideon) in accord with all the good that he had done to Israel." (**Judges 8:33–35, LSB**)

This passage is more than a historical tragedy—it's a mirror. It reflects what happens when spiritual memory fades and intentional discipleship is neglected. It reminds us that ministry is *not* just about what we



build in our lifetime, but what we leave behind for those who follow.

Psalm 145:4 declares:

"One generation shall laud Your works to another, And shall declare Your mighty deeds." (**LSB**)

This is not a passive hope—it's an active mandate. Legacy is not automatic. It must be remembered, honored, and handed on with care.

The Quiet Collapse

Todd Rhoades sounds the alarm in **Silent Alarm: The Quiet Collapse of the Church Staff Pipeline**:

"The leadership pipeline is thinning—not just in the pulpit, but across the board: worship, youth, kids, and executive roles are all drying up."

This echoes **Judges 8:34**—when spiritual memory fades, the next generation falters. The thinning pipeline is not just a staffing issue; it's a discipleship crisis.

"Most churches aren't hearing the quiet alarm. Staff roles are going unfilled. Search timelines are stretching into months. Young leaders are opting out before they even get started."

This quote underscores the urgency of **2 Timothy 2:2**:

"And the things which you have heard from me in the

presence of many witnesses, entrust these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also." (**LSB**)

If we don't entrust the mission now, we risk silence tomorrow.

"Rebuilding ministry isn't just about strategy—it's about obedience and spiritual leadership."

This aligns with our call to "walk it out" from **1 John 2:6**:

"The one who says he abides in Him ought himself to walk in the same manner as He walked." (**LSB**)

Legacy isn't built on clever systems—it's built on faithful lives.


Seven Commitments for Generational Ministry

1 Remember the •Faithfulness of God

Israel's failure began with forgetfulness. **"They did not remember Yahweh their God..."** (**Judges 8:34, LSB**)

We must be storytellers of grace, rehearsing the mighty acts of God in our homes, churches, and communities.

2. Honor Those Who Came Before

“They did not show lovingkindness to the household of Jerubbaal...” (Judges 8:35, LSB)

Honoring spiritual predecessors is not about nostalgia—it's about gratitude.

3. Entrust the Mission to Others

As Paul instructed Timothy, we are to entrust the Gospel to faithful people who will teach others also.

This means mentoring, equipping, and releasing—not just to serve, but to lead.

4. Rejoice in the Fruit

“I rejoiced greatly to find some of your children walking in truth.” (2 John 1:4, LSB)

There is no greater joy than seeing those we've discipled walking in obedience.

As Paul instructed Timothy, we are to entrust the gospel to faithful people who will teach others also.

5. Walk It Out
“The one who says he abides in Him ought himself to walk in the same manner as He walked.” (1 John 2:6, LSB)

Our lives are the curriculum. Our obedience is the legacy.

6. Challenge the Next Generation to Ask the Right Question

Instead of “*What do you want to do with your life?*” we must teach:

“Lord, what would You have me do?”

Jesus called His disciples to follow Him (**Matthew 4:19**). Paul told Timothy to guard the Gospel (**2 Timothy 2:2**).

Major Ian Thomas captured this beautifully:

“You were not saved to be a sensation. You were saved to be a servant... The only right to which you have is the right to be put by the hand of God wherever He chooses...”

7. Build a Ministry Pipeline That Flows with Purpose

Stage: Role in the Pipeline

☒ Home: Parents model obedience, prayer, and love for the Word

☒ Church: Nurtures gifts, provides opportunities, affirms calling

☒ Bible College: Deepens theological roots and prepares leaders



☒ Sending Agency:

Ensures accountability, support, and placement

☒ Mission Field:

Deploys workers with clarity and conviction. This pipeline must be cultivated. When each link is strong and aligned, the next generation is not just equipped—they're deployed.

In Village Missions, we're addressing this through our **On-Ramp** college program and the **Contenders Discipleship Initiative (CDI)**—identifying, training, and launching leaders from rural churches into long-term ministry.

A Rural Reminder

For those of us serving in rural communities, this call is especially urgent.

Rural doesn't mean irrelevant. It means rooted. And roots are where legacy begins.

A Final Word

Robby Gallaty said it well:

“The Gospel came to you because it was heading to someone else.” — Long Hollow Church

We are not the endpoint of God's work—we are a link in the chain.

Let us remember, honor, and entrust. And let us rejoice when the next generation walks in truth.

The Expansion of Harvest Radio

September 1, 2025!

That is when Harvest Radio completes 21 years on the air on 102.7 in Nova Russas. And that is the goal for going on the air on 104.7 in a town called Ibiapina (two hours north of Nova Russas). Harvest Radio will soon double in coverage and outreach! And here in Mucambo, we will get a clear signal from the new radio station.

- For this great opportunity.
- That after many discouraging delays, we finally have a signed purchase contract.
- That so many have been generously giving to this project.
- That we will be able to reach so many more people through the radio waves.
- For a group of people from among our churches/towns who want to help advertise the new station with a personal distribution of advertisement flyers.

- For the many details of setup to be attended to by September 1.
- Elwyn (Ivan's brother) is primarily responsible for getting it set up. His son, Nathan, and a friend of the family, Jesse Regier, will be coming for a couple of weeks to help with the technical/computer stuff.

FM 102.7 has been on the air for almost 21 years.
FM 104.7 is the new frequency.

The Church of the Lamb

- ♦ In July, we had VBS. While we didn't have as big a group this year, 35-40 kids came each day to sing, hear stories from the book of Daniel, and play.
- ♦ At church we have three weekly activities: the service on Sunday evening, prayer meeting on Tuesday evening, and Bible Club on Saturday morning. (photos on second page)
- ♦ The Saturday morning Bible Club fairly consistently attracts 30+ kids. It is a time for singing, Bible story and verse memorization and also for playing games. We have lately been using the book, The Lamb (by John R. Cross), to teach about the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross and salvation. We used this book with the children in our initial years of ministry in Mucambo but felt it was time to repeat because we have almost a whole new set of children.
- ♦ On Tuesday nights, we usually have a time in the Word and prayer. After that, some of us go to read Scripture in the homes of some of our young people. Recently, we have initiated doing prayer walks in the town. We do it individually, but last Tuesday, we split into two groups, each group walking several blocks;

stopping to pray for people we saw on the street or for the homes, schools and businesses we walked by.

Praise the Lord:

- For the VBS and the kids who attended.
- For those who regularly come to our services and the Bible Club
- For the open doors to read Scripture in people's home. Many have never sat down to read the Bible before.

Pray:

- For the kids who attended VBS, that they will believe the truths about salvation taught there.
- For those who attend or have visited our church service, that they will believe for salvation and will grow in their faith, and that they will participate in outreach.
- For Scripture reading in homes, that the hearing of the Word will bring about salvation.

Café e Graça Coffee Shop

The coffee shop continues to serve as a place of outreach/evangelism and teaching opportunities. It is well accepted in the community. We have had an unexpected setback as two of the guys who have been working there have made some very poor choices, and we had to let them go. We continue to pray for their spiritual life. They accepted Christ with us several years ago. We still have two guys working there along with us and Joshua and Camila. We continue to try to teach them and be examples to them of living for Christ.






